UNOOSA & SPACE TRUST MoU - Signed 1st June 2018



The MOU was signed between the two entities to provide a framework of cooperation to further their shared goals and objectives. "UNOOSA" has the mandate to promote international cooperation in the peaceful exploration and use of outer space and peaceful application of space science and technology, whereas Space Trust was founded on the principle of Making Space the New Frontier for Peace in support of the work of UNOOSA and COPUOS, with a particular focus on injecting an inspirational perspective about innovative Space Diplomacy toward SPACE2030, in support of the 2030 UN Sustainable Development Agenda.
